The said narrowing of traffic lanes are in my view dangerous to all road users including pedestrians while at the same time creating unnecessary pinch points that add to the current traffic chaos throughout our city.

I would further ask that a subcommittee of the relevant agencies i.e., Cork City Council, Taxi Federation, Bus Eireann, An Garda, private bus operators, and others as deemed required plus one Councillor from each ward be set up with a remit to review our current

traffic management systems and bring forward and introduce the changes required to alleviate the current traffic chaos in all areas under the jurisdiction of Cork City Council.’

11. **ANTI SOCIAL ISSUES AT ARDPATRICK AVENUE, BLACKPOOL**

‘That Cork City Council put in place suitable and effective measures in order to regulate pedestrian access through Ardpatrik Avenue off Assumption Road in Blackpool.

Cork City Council have recently taken this Estate in Charge, and the Residents are appealing to Cork City Council along with the support of the Gardai and Local Representatives to implement suitable and effective measures to counteract the growing levels of very serious Anti-Social Behaviour undertaken on a daily basis by groups of Youths using Ardpatrik Avenue residential estate as a through access to and from the Blackpool area.

Private property is being regularly vandalised. Cars are being broken into and damaged on a regular basis. Wheelie Bins are being burnt out, toppled over and the estate is being left in a heavily littered state as a result of this ongoing and increasing levels of Anti-Social Behaviour. The Residents have become prisoners in their own homes, too afraid to venture out and the young children of the estate are unable to use the Green areas or indeed any area in the estate for recreational purposes.

While we fully accept that this is primarily a Policing issue, we as the Local Authority with governance over the Infrastructure and its influence on our Local Community, can certainly play a key part in the resolution of this very worrying issue by the implementation of regulation of the access through the estate. An example would be the erection of palisade railings and a Gate between Ardpatrik Avenue and Ardpatrik Close. Obviously, this would have to be discussed and agreed by all parties involved.

The Gardai are currently working closely with the Residents on a daily basis and have identified this area as an "Anti-Social Hot Spot" warranting extra monitoring in terms of Policing. At a recent Meeting with Residents and a number of Public Representatives in Ardpatrik Avenue, the Gardai agreed that regulating the access through Ardpatrik Avenue would certainly make this area far easier to Police.

We ask that Cork City Council engage with the Local Public Representatives, Gardai and the Ardpatrik Residents Association in order to discuss potential suitable actions that could be implemented in order to resolve this increasingly worrying problem.’
