28.1 **SLIPROAD FROM DUNKETTLE TO THE M8 (DEFERRED FROM THE ORDINARY MEETING OF AN CHOMHAIRLE HELD 14th NOVEMBER 2022)**

‘Dear Cork City Council would it be possible please to contact the NTA and ask them to reopen the slip road which was closed recently leading from Dunkettle on to the M8 motorway. Since the road closure traffic through Glanmire is gridlocked and causing major delays. The alternative route through Little Island is not working and the closure of the slip road is premature and should be closed on completion of the Dunkettle interchange.’

28.2 **IRISH WATER NOTIFICATIONS**

‘That Irish Water be directed by Cork City Council, while it still has a role in water supply and maintenance, to notify residents properly in areas where scheduled shut-offs are due to occur and not call on them to rely on random website updates for information which is not operable.’

(Proposer Cllr. M. Finn 22/494)

28.3 **ADDITIONAL PUBLIC TRANSPORT SERVICES**

‘That Cork City Council supports the provision of additional public transport services (e.g. increased number of commuter rail carriages, additional city bus services, etc.) and free public transport from the city centre to event venues (e.g. Páirc Uí Chaoimh) during high-attendance events and will write to the National Transport Authority on the matter.’

(Proposer: Cllr. O. Moran 22/500)

28.4 **REPLACE RETIRING GP AT ASHDALE MEDICAL CENTRE, BLARNEY**

‘That Cork City Council will write to the H.S.E seeking an update on the process to replace the retiring GP at Ashdale Medical Centre, Blarney, and on arrangements for patients in the interim, considering the importance of ensuring a full-time practice remains going forward.’

(Proposer: Cllr. M. Nugent 22/508)

28.5 **MEANWHILE USE PROJECTS**

‘That Cork City Council recognises that:

- Meanwhile use has potential as a legitimate source of employment and temporary regeneration in brownfield sites.
- The Marina Market has highlighted a desire within Cork city for vibrant, innovative meanwhile use projects.

- Cork city will be transformed through Project 2040 but that much of this development will take long periods of time.
- Cities like Paris and London have seen huge success in meanwhile use project.
- Meanwhile use currently exists within a policy and legislative vacuum which is acting as a barrier to the success of project.
- Discourse around meanwhile use has been overwhelmingly positive but this hasn't been matched by action.
- Cork city represents a unique opportunity for meanwhile use projects given population and development projections and high levels of brownfield sites in central locations.
- The post-industrial nature of Cork city leaves large centrally located areas vacant with future plans intending to change use depending on footfall into these areas.
- Meanwhile use is an opportunity to increase footfall in new central areas.
- The Heritage Council work 'Leaba Te' on meanwhile use provides a clear argument for the potentially transformative impact of these projects.

And agrees to:

- Commission a report on sites with potential for meanwhile use, with a focus on brownfield sites earmarked for regeneration.
- Write to the Oireachtas Housing Committee identifying the gap in policy and legislative frameworks for meanwhile use and requesting they undertake the drafting of a report into this.
- Write to the Minister for Housing to request that Cork City Council be considered for a pilot of meanwhile use policy and that provision be made in the proposed revised planning legislation to reflect this.
- Engage with the Meanwhile Foundation to explore potential meanwhile use projects in Cork city and learn from their experiences.'

28.6 **WATER QUALITY CHECKS**

'That Cork City Council ask Irish Water to carry out a water quality check on Cork's Northside as the residents in Mayfield, Ballyvolane, Shanakiel, Farranree, St. Luke's have ongoing issues now for months with residents paying for bottled water and many residents being put at risk with constant water quality issues.'

‘With a request to install double yellow lines across a driveway at St. Joseph's (to prevent regular blockages) still unresolved, and mindful of a request to move the disabled drivers parking bay away from the entrance to Millbrook Lawn where blue badge cars are being damaged by other cars pulling in, can an audit of the short stretch of road be carried out with a view to resolving issues at this busy junction.’

5. **FOOTPATH BETWEEN KILLEENS AND NORTHPOINT BUSINESS PARK**

Insurance companies are advising homeowners who want house insurance to get on to their local Council to change flood risk zoning areas.’
