“NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the advertised DRAFT BYE -LAWS MADE BY CORK CITY COUNCIL FOR PROHIBITION OF CONSUMPTION OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR ON THE STREETS OF CORK AND IN PUBLIC PLACES WITHIN THE CITY OF CORK are approved with the following amendment, by inclusion of the following text, after Bye Law 10:-

10 a. Where a member of An Garda Síochána is of the opinion that a person is committing or has committed an offence to which Section 204 or Section 205 of the Local Government Act 2001 relates, the member of An Garda Síochána may:-

demand the name and address of such person and if that demand is refused or the person gives a name or address, which is false or misleading, that person shall be guilty of an offence under Section 204 (3) (b) of the Local Government Act 2001.

The new Bye-Laws (and the revocation of the Cork City Council (Prohibition of Consumption of Intoxicating Liquor on Streets and In Public Places) Bye Laws 2001 and amendments thereto contained therein) shall come into force and effect on the 17th day of January, 2022, being not less than 30 days after the Council meeting adopting and making these bye-laws, in accordance with the provisions of section 200(5)(a) of the Local Government Act, 2001.”

‘That Cork City Council write to the Taoiseach, the Tánaiste, the Minister for Transport and Dublin City Council to express this Council’s support for the proposal by Cork South West TD Michael Collins to erect a monument and statue of the great Cork Patriot Michael Collins in Dublin City centre and to ask that consideration also be given to erecting monuments and statues of Tomás Mac Curtain and Terence MacSwiney in our Nation’s capital in recognition of Collins, Mac Curtain and MacSwiney’s contribution to the struggle for Irish independence and the establishment of an independent Irish State.’

28.4 **REVERSE DECISION TO TENDER FOR LOCAL EMPLOYMENT SERVICE**

‘That Cork City Council notes that:

- Cork City Local Employment Service has been operated by Cork City Partnership since 1996 and is committed to assisting unemployed people to progress towards employment by responding to their individual needs for training, education and access to employment opportunities
- Cork Local Employment Services have very successfully provided an essential public service for over 25 years
- The 7 community-based partnerships are at the core of their local communities in Blackpool, Churchfield, Knocknaheeny, Mahon, Old Youghal Road, Washington Street and Togher

- The LES provides practical support, advice, guidance and information relating to employment, training and welfare to work options
- The LES is at risk due to a central government decision to tender for these services
- The tendering process will turn the service over to for-profit private companies

And agrees to:

- Write to Minister Heather Humphreys to request a reversal of the decision to tender for LES
- Call on the government to end the ‘privatisation’ of LES
- Support the LES in their campaign to retain their service.’

28.5 **TERMINATE NEGOTIATIONS WITH IRISH WATER**

‘The trade unions SIPTU, ForSa, and Connect are currently in negotiations with Irish Water and local authorities, with the aim of transferring 3,500 workers from the local authorities to Irish Water. If these negotiations are successful, they will have a major negative impact on the ability of local authorities, such as Cork City Council, to continue to provide essential services to its citizens, and furthermore, will lead to Irish Water becoming a private company, resulting in our water, waste water treatment, and sewage services falling into private ownership. This privatisation would be a disaster for our public utilities, as well as for the conditions for workers in this sector. I therefore urge the Council to call on these trade unions to immediately terminate these negotiations, and that this motion is forwarded to the relevant trade unions.’

28.6 **BUS ROUTE FROM GRANGE ROAD TO SOUTH DOUGLAS ROAD**

‘That Cork City Council write to the National Transport Authority asking it to maintain the existing bus route from the Grange Road to the South Douglas Road by ensuring that the new No 8 bus route being proposed by Bus Connects travels from the Grange Road to the City Centre via the South Douglas Road instead of via the Douglas Road.’
