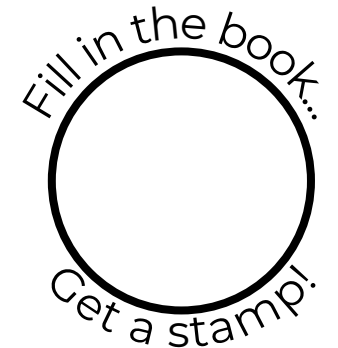

## Medals have symbols of important people, places, and things on them.



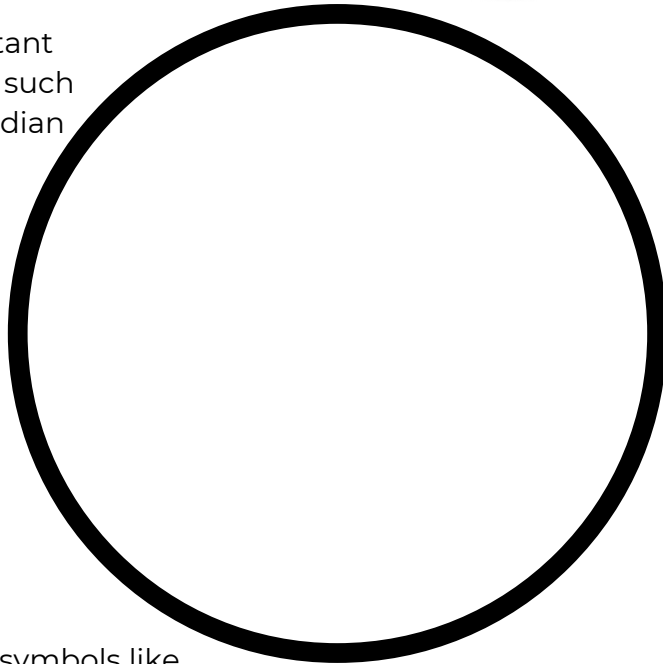
Some medals have images of a ruling king or queen.



Other medals have important places depicted on them, such as this one showing the Indian fort at Jamrud and its surrounding mountains.



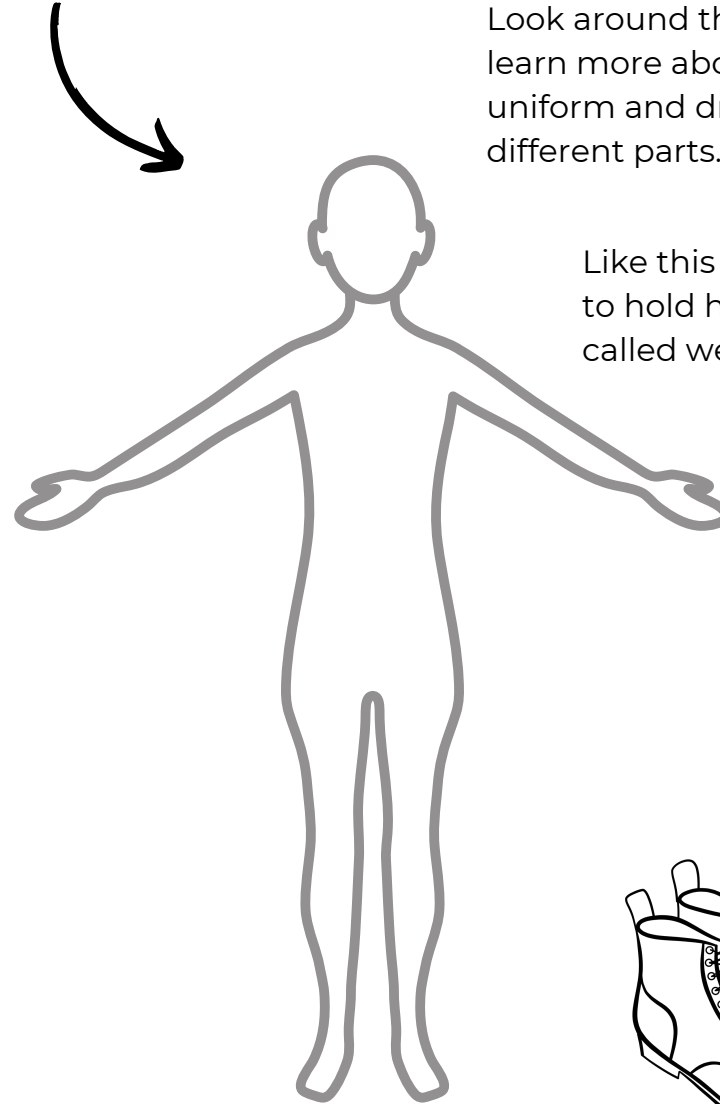

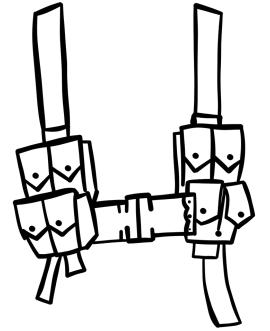
